
WHAT IS CAMCA?

The CAMCA (Central Asia-Mongolia-Caucasus-Afghanistan) Regional Forum is a non-political and non-partisan entity established to promote region-wide discussions on means of advancing economic growth and development in Greater Central Asia (Afghanistan, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan). It promotes this goal by fostering dialogue and interaction among rising young leaders from all sectors in the 10 countries of the region, as well as with international leaders and stakeholders.

Countries of the region are all evaluating and elaborating models of future economic, political and social development. Expanded communication and collaboration among talented professionals from a range of fields can contribute to this process on both a national and regional basis.

The CAMCA Regional Forum has evolved out of the Rumsfeld Foundation's Fellowship Program at the Central Asia-Caucasus Institute at Johns Hopkins University-SAIS. Since 2008, over 145 regional leaders have completed the Fellowship Program.

The 2016 CAMCA Regional Forum in Tbilisi, Georgia will discuss ongoing developments in the region as well as outlooks on broader global trends. The Forum will consist of plenary sessions, keynote addresses and a variety of panels on topics including recent geopolitical and economic developments, intraregional trade and transport, business and investment opportunities in the region, regional security issues and much more. Attendees will include Rumsfeld Fellowship alumni and other professionals from the CAMCA region and broader international community.

Welcome to Tbilisi, the 1,500 year-old capital of Georgia. Visitors to this vibrant city are encouraged to explore the unique offerings of a land of vast history and ingenuity, and to enjoy a distinct and dynamic culture at the crossroads where the East meets the West. Like Steinbeck, perhaps you have already heard the country's name expressed with fond nostalgia or great admiration. Perhaps also like Steinbeck, you may soon believe that in Georgia you might find a second heaven.



The "Paris of Eurasia," renowned for its hospitality, superb wine and cuisine, melodic songs and effervescent dances, is an exceptional city with significant diversity and a rich cultural composition. It is where time seems to stop, as ancient mingles with modern and past coexists with future. On the list of the world's most breathtaking places to visit, the memory of Tbilisi and Georgia will stay with you everywhere you go.

While enjoying a flair for modernity, Tbilisi lives and breathes by history. Its roots are linked to the legendary 5th century King of Georgia, Vakhtang I Gorgasali, who built the city near

the hot springs discovered during a royal hunt, which would eventually lend themselves to the city's naming, rooted in the old Georgian word, "Tbili," meaning "warm." Nowadays, Tbilisi's world-renowned sulfur baths remain a major tourist destination in the oldest quarter of the city.

Multi-culturalism and tolerance have always been among Tbilisi's most distinctive traits. Located at a strategic nexus of the ancient Silk Road, the city has long been a melting pot of various cultures, languages, religions, traditions and customs, and remains so today with Georgian citizens of more than 80

ethnicities currently coexisting within its borders. In Tbilisi you will find churches of various denominations and synagogues and mosques built side by side – the ancient Anchiskhati Basilica, the Sioni Cathedral, pearl-domed Armenian churches, a spectacular Jewish synagogue, a Jumrah Mosque and out on the horizon of the Elijah Mount, the Trinity Cathedral – the biggest orthodox church of Georgia symbolizing the unity of the Georgian nation.

The Old Town district is situated between the Botanical Gardens and the shadow of the imposing historic Narikala

Fortress, which dominates the iconic skyline. Nearby you will find numerous modern restaurants, clubs and art galleries located at the focal Chardin Street, named after a French Catholic missionary and scholar who once resided there. Continuing along the Mtkvari River leads you into the heart of Old Tbilisi with its picturesque Meidan square, famous for its thermal spas and a beautiful waterfall. A walk across the charming pedestrian Peace Bridge will take you to Rike Park situated on the opposite bank of the Mtkvari River. Close by are the recently renovated and charming Rustaveli and Agmashenebeli avenues, featuring sights such as the National Museum of Georgia, Museum of Soviet Occupation,

Art Museum of Georgia and further along, the Tbilisi Open Air Museum of Ethnography.

For those fascinated with historic memorials and monuments, the "Georgian Stonehenge" is located on the hill by the Tbilisi Sea, with its impressively decorated pillars and long rows of statues of Georgian Kings. But what what surpasses it all is a ride in a modern cableway to the Tbilisi Funicular Complex on the top of the Mtatsminda Mountain overlooking the city's stunning panoramic views. Other impressive sights include the Gabriadze Theater located in the heart of the historic



quarter with its beautiful clock tower and dancing figurines, or the Dry Bridge, home to a famous flea market where art and antiques are on display.

As Tbilisi's international reputation quickly grew after Georgia's independence in 1991, the city has continued to play host to a number of large-scale international forums and high-level events attracting leading business professionals and politicians from around the world. Moreover, after recently hosting a major European Youth Olympic Festival and the UEFA Super Cup final, Tbilisi marks a new hub for European sports alongside a surge of sporting and athletics development in the capital.



Beyond its cultural and historical importance, Tbilisi is steadily transforming into a regional hub for trade, transportation, energy, finance and tourism. Due to its business-friendly environment and strategic location, the city continues to attract major business projects, including pivotal railroads and pipelines across the area, aiming to fully unlock the potential of the surrounding region. Embracing its European heritage, Georgia continues along its path toward EU and NATO membership, and Tbilisi, much like the rest of the country, enjoys benefits from the Deep and Comprehensive Free Trade Agreement with the EU and works vigorously to deepen its other global trade ties, including its strong strategic partnership with the United States. These developments and more attest to Georgia's aspirations to attract investment and expand its access to the vibrant regional, European, Asian and U.S. markets, and to become a true superhighway of communication and trade.

Perhaps most representative of Tbilisi, are the charming and creative tbilisians who preserve the genuine spirit and character of the city. Once you have had a chance to enjoy their warm hospitality, you will be ready to return to experience Tbilisi all over again, and, indeed, Georgia will always be on your mind.

Welcome to Tbilisi. While here, we hope you create your own history in this dynamic city that will always remain with you everywhere you go.

The program brings individuals from Central Asia, the Caucasus, Afghanistan and Mongolia to Washington, D.C. to pursue research projects and establish ties with their counterparts in the United States.

The program also connects talented professionals from across the region, encouraging an intraregional exchange of ideas, as well as fosters better understanding and stronger relations among the United States and the countries of the region.

Over a period of six weeks, each group of Fellows meets with policy makers, business leaders, journalists, academics and regional experts to better understand how opinion making, decision making, and policy making and implementation processes work in Washington, D.C.

As of June 2016, after 16 successful Fellowship sessions, there have been a total of 147 program participants from 10 countries. 

These programs offer insights as to how communities and city governments work with businesses, civil organizations and individuals to bring benefits to the economy and society. 

RUMSFELD FELLOWSHIP CONFERENCES

After five years of successful fellowship sessions, in the summer of 2012 the Rumsfeld Foundation hosted the first regional meeting of its alumni. Since that initial meeting, the Foundation has hosted annual alumni gatherings, which since 2014 have taken place alongside the CAMCA Regional Forums.



Batumi, Georgia - June 23-26, 2012 - The inaugural Fellowship Conference explored a wide range of issues affecting the region such as transportation, trade barriers, energy security and diversification, Russia's and China's foreign policies, security in Afghanistan and business and investment opportunities in Greater Central Asia. Ambassador Batu Kutelia, Deputy Secretary of the National Security Council of Georgia and former Ambassador to the U.S., provided keynote remarks



Lake Issyk Kul, Kyrgyzstan - June 22-25, 2013 - The 2013 Fellowship Conference hosted discussions on several regional topics including investment climates and economic outlooks, foreign direct investment, entrepreneurship and SMEs, transportation and the political transition in Afghanistan. Dr. S. Frederick Starr provided keynote remarks.

CAMCA REGIONAL FORUMS

Following the success of previous alumni conferences, in 2014 the Rumsfeld Foundation and program alumni organized a broader regional forum to allow interested professionals an opportunity to participate. The CAMCA (Central Asia-Mongolia-Caucasus-Afghanistan) Regional Forum was established to create a platform for the young leaders of the alumni network to engage with a larger international audience invested in the future of the region. The inaugural Forum was held in June 2014 in Astana, Kazakhstan.

2014 CAMCA Regional Forum, Astana, Kazakhstan – June 20-22, 2014

The Forum opened with remarks from Dr. Steve Cambone, Rumsfeld Foundation Board Member and Dr. S. Frederick Starr, followed by a welcoming address by Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of Kazakhstan, Yerzhan Ashikbayev. The ensuing panels and discussions explored topics including "Macro-economic Stability and Foreign Direct Investments Along the New Transportation Corridors," "Models of Economic Cooperation: From European Union to Eurasian Union and Beyond," "Bridging Asia and Europe: Transportation and Transit Potential of CAMCA," and "Exploring Linkages Between Economic Development and National Security in the CAMCA Region." Ms. Madina Abylkassymova, Vice-Minister of Economy and Budget Planning of Kazakhstan, provided keynote remarks on the "Kazakhstan 2050 Strategy."



Participants included business leaders, government officials, regional experts and other professionals from across the region and beyond. Additional speakers and panelists included representatives from institutions such as the European Bank of Reconstruction and Development, the Ministry of Industry and New Technologies of Kazakhstan, the Public Policy Institute of the Nur Otan Party in Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Concept Ltd. and McKinsey & Company. Support throughout the Forum was provided by partners: the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Kazakhstan and the Nazarbayev Center.

2015 CAMCA Regional Forum, Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia – June 20-21, 2015

The Forum agenda included opening remarks from Secretary Rumsfeld and Dr. S. Frederick Starr, and a keynote address from Speaker of the Mongolian Parliament, Enkhbold Zandaakhuu. Several plenary panels, interviews and dialogue sessions followed, focused around three themes: "CAMCA's Evolving Place in the World Economy," "Foreign and Security Outlook of CAMCA in 2025," and "Unlocking the Potential of CAMCA's Human Capital." Speakers and participants included notable professionals from Mongolia, the broader CAMCA region, Europe, India, the Republic of Korea, the United States and more.

Keynote speaker, Ambassador Zalmay Khalilzad, presented his insights on developments in Afghanistan and discussed prospects for future cooperation among the countries of the CAMCA region. The following day, former Kyrgyz Prime Minister Djoomart Otorbaev made a keynote address on the importance of the evolution of democracy in the CAMCA region and the role Mongolia plays as a model for successful democratic transitions for its neighbors.



Key conclusions drawn from the Forum indicated that there is a need for closer cooperation, transparency and shared expertise across all sectors throughout the region. Additional takeaways from dialogue sessions included: the removal of barriers for investment across the region is essential; the diversification of economies and markets in the CAMCA countries is of key importance; CAMCA citizens need to further develop and build ties among their countries through business networks and joint investment projects; and, the main driver of change in the region will be human capital and further development in this area will require the growth of civil society and cultures of volunteerism.

Attendees enjoyed several cultural activities including exceptional performances by the Mongolian Military Band and Dance Troupe organized by Forum partner, the Mongolian Ministry of Defense. In addition, there was a trip to the Chinggis Khaan Monument followed by a dinner at Terej National Park, where Secretary Rumsfeld and Deputy Defense Minister Battur Avirmed made closing remarks.



ABOUT THE RUMSFELD FOUNDATION

The book spans his career and is complemented by extensive primary source documentation that can be found on his website, Rumsfeld.com. His second book, *Rumsfeld's Rules*, was published in May 2013, and was also featured on the New York Times Best Seller list. Recently, Rumsfeld ventured into the tech world, with the launch of his Churchill Solitaire "app." All of Rumsfeld's profits from his memoir, *Known and Unknown*, and from his Churchill Solitaire app are donated to the military charities supported by the Rumsfeld Foundation.

Mr. Rumsfeld completed his second tour as Secretary of Defense in December 2006. During his tenure, he led the U.S. Department of Defense after the attack on 9/11 and in overseeing the reform and transformation of America's military to meet the new challenges of the 21st Century.

A graduate of Princeton University and former naval aviator, Rumsfeld previously served as a Congressman, U.S. Ambassador to NATO, White House Chief of Staff under President Ford, Presidential Envoy to the Middle East for President Reagan, and CEO of two Fortune 500 companies and Chairman of a third. Rumsfeld and his wife have three children, seven grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren. They reside in New Mexico, and spend time in Montana, Maryland, and Washington, D.C.

JOYCE RUMSFELD

Co-founder and Vice President

Joyce Rumsfeld was born in Billings, Montana and after moving to Fargo, ND, Minneapolis, MN, and Milwaukee, WI, she ended up in the Chicago area. She graduated from New Trier High School where she and her husband, Don Rumsfeld, were classmates, and later received a B.A. in Art History from the University of Colorado in 1954. Mrs. Rumsfeld was the founder of the Chicago Foundation for Education (CFE) in 1985 and served as Chairman of its Board of Directors for thirteen years. The Foundation is dedicated to improving the education of children in Chicago public elementary schools. In the last 30 years, CFE has invested more than \$6.5 million in the Chicago Public Schools, impacting nearly 30,000 teachers and more than 1 million students. Mrs. Rumsfeld has served on the Big Shoulders Program at the Archdiocese of Chicago, the National Advisory Council of Character Education Partnership, Inc., and the U.S. Department of Education's Fund for Improvement of Post-Secondary Education. She also served on the Board of Visitors and Governors at St. John's College for 12 years. In honor of her work with members of the U.S. military and their families, on December 15, 2006, Mrs. Rumsfeld was awarded the Department of Defense's Distinguished Public Service Award. Mrs. Rumsfeld currently chairs the Rumsfeld Foundation with her husband. They have three children, seven grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren and reside in New Mexico.



Dr. Steve Cambone

Director

Dr. Cambone is a member of the Board of Directors of the Rumsfeld Foundation. He is an independent consultant advising leaders and managers in strategic plans and planning, operations, resource allocation and the use of technology to transform operations and business practices. He is the founder of Adirondack Advisors, LLC, and an advisor to tech start-ups, companies serving the national security market and non-profits. Dr. Cambone sits on the Proxy Board of MDA IS LLC and chairs its Government Security Committee and on the Special Security Board of Elbit Systems of America. He served as a Thomas W. Smith Senior Fellow at Villanova and is an adjunct faculty member at Johns Hopkins. From 2007-12 he served in senior positions for QinetiQ North America, including the Senior and Executive VP for Strategic Development. Prior, he served from 2001-06 in the Department of Defense during which he was twice nominated by President Bush and confirmed for senior positions, including as the first Undersecretary of Defense for Intelligence. Dr. Cambone was awarded the DoD Distinguished Public Service Medal and the National Intelligence Distinguished Service Medal by the DNI. He was a Senior Fellow at the Center for Strategic and International Studies and Director of Research at the Institute for National Security Studies at the National Defense University. He is a member of the Advisory Board of the Intelligence and National Security Alliance and the Advisory Board of the Volgenau School of IT and Engineering at George Mason University. Dr. Cambone holds Ph.D. and Master's degrees in Political Science from Claremont Graduate School and Bachelor's degree in Political Science from The Catholic University of America.

Chairman

S. Frederick Starr is the founding Chairman of the Central Asia-Caucasus Institute and Silk Road Studies Program, and a Research Professor at Johns Hopkins University-SAIS. His research on the countries of Greater Central Asia, their history, development, internal dynamics, as well as on U.S. policy towards the region, has resulted in 23 books and more than 200 published articles. He has also written extensively on architecture, music, and Russian politics and culture. One of his recent books, "The Ferghana Valley: The Heart of Central Asia," involved the collaboration of some dozen scholars in four countries.

During the past decade, Dr. Starr has returned repeatedly to addressing the challenges of reopening continental-wide transport passing through Central Asia and Afghanistan, which he sees as a key to success in Afghanistan. This issue was the subject of a series of articles he published between 2000-2008, and of his book, "The New Silk Roads" (2008). For Starr's articles that have had direct policy implications, refer to "Beyond the Fog of Nation Building: An Economic Strategy for Afghanistan" and "Finish the Job: An Economic Strategy for Afghanistan." In October 2013, his major publication, "Lost Enlightenment: Central Asia's Golden Age from the Arab Invasion to Tamerlane," was published and is currently being translated into several languages worldwide.



Dr. Svante Cornell

Director

Svante E. Cornell is the Director of the Central Asia-Caucasus Institute and Silk Road Studies Program, a co-founder of the Institute for Security and Development Policy in Stockholm and an Associate Research Professor at Johns Hopkins University-SAIS. His main areas of expertise include security issues, state-building, and transnational crime in Southwest and Central Asia, with a specific focus on the Caucasus and Turkey. He is the Editor of the Central Asia-Caucasus Analyst, the Joint Center's bi-weekly publication, and of the Joint Center's "Silk Road Papers" series.

Dr. Cornell is the author of several books, including "Small Nations and Great Powers: the Ethnopolitical Conflict in the Caucasus" (2001), the first comprehensive study of the post-Soviet Caucasus, and "Azerbaijan since Independence" (2011). His dozens of articles have appeared in numerous academic and policy journals.

Dr. Cornell received his undergraduate education at the Middle East Technical University in Ankara, Turkey, and he holds a Ph.D. in Peace and Conflict Studies from Uppsala University. He also holds an honorary doctoral degree from the National Academy of Sciences of Azerbaijan. He is a member of the Swedish Royal Academy of Military Science and a Research Fellow with the Wilfried Martens Center for European Studies in Brussels.



Dr. Mamuka Tsereteli

Research Director

Mamuka Tsereteli is the Research Director at the Central Asia-Caucasus Institute and Silk Road Studies Program. He previously served as the Director of the Center for Black Sea-Caspian Studies at the School of International Service at American University. He also served as an Assistant Professor at the School of International Service from 2007-2011. Dr. Tsereteli teaches classes on energy markets and energy security at Johns Hopkins University-SAIS and at American University. He speaks frequently at events related to international relations, economic development, energy security and country risk analysis in the Caucasus and Central Asia. His areas of expertise include international relations and international economic policy, economic and energy security, political and economic risk analysis and mitigation strategies, and business development.
